ARTIST STATEMENT

When it comes to life or art, Marinova has never believed in concrete plans and precise concepts. The most realistic and workable plan for her would be a combination of vision and knowledge; decisions being made during the process; coincidences and mistakes. The paradoxical aspect about Marinova's practice is perhaps the fact that she never draws up a coherent plan about it, but she always strive to have control over many aspects of it, remaining guided by her intuition as well. This oxymoron the artist calls a natural habitat.

Indeed, the beginning of a project or a body of work is always a blend between freedom and chaos combined with rules and order. Many of the projects begin with analogue ink large format drawings. Line by line, the chaos is taking a shape and the order is beginning to look abstract. These drawings are transformed into unique screenprints in which repetition is often used as a tool. This personal action Marinova calls "a deep-diving act in her own imagination, being unclear how long she will spend "underwater". Sometimes these starting points are marked by memories-like of certain things, places or images which have never been experienced before, but paradoxically define enough so they can be used as a base of her projects and concepts.

Last but not least is the process of installing the works where the two dimensional pieces transform into rooms, creatures or just becoming a separate space. Exploring the unknown corners of my own imagination, I am wrapping a given place (space) with my own thoughts, feelings and concepts where everyone is invited to step into.

In the past few years Marinova is questioning the idea of the space and time between events and moments in life in which nothing is happening as well our in-between state. These moments and events she sees as gaps and cracks which are fulfilling our life and shaping our perception of it.

BIO

Born in 1994 in Varna, Bulgaria, Zhanina Marinova studied Graphics and Printmaking at the University of Applied Arts Vienna, Austria where she currently lives and works as a Visual artist and Printmaker.

By rendering imagination as a sort of materialized fiction, which for her is strongly connected with the idea of the relation between presence and absence, Marinova invents her own reality and explores the deep constellations of perception, thoughts, feelings and memories.

The paradoxical aspect about her practice is perhaps the fact that she never draws up a coherent plan about it, but always strive to have control over many aspects of it, remaining guided by her intuition as well. Working primarily in the field of screen printing, drawing, installation and book arts, Marinova uses such diverse materials as fabrics, paper, transparent foils, mesh and plexiglass as canvases for her screen prints.

Marinova's works have been exhibited at different institutions and art fairs such as mumok - Museum of Modern Art Ludwig (A), St. Michael's Church Vienna (A), Künstlerhaus Wien (A), PARALLEL Vienna (A), PARALLEL Editions (A), ART Vienna Art Fair (A), Wittgenstein Haus (A), International Print Biennial Varna (BG), Sofia Art Week (BG).

In the past 8 years she participated in more than 60 exhibitions, 9 of which solo ones. She is a member of the Austrian Association of Artists (Künstlerhaus Wien) since 2018.

Marinova is represented by Galerie Rudolf Leeb (A) since 2019 and works with the platform for young artists KAH (A). Since 2022 the artist is developing and working on her personal project called "INTERSTICE".


BEDTIME STORIES

'Bedtime Stories' is the ninth chapter of Zhanina Marinova's personal project, 'INTERSTICE'. The works in the exhibition symbolise intimacy, creativity and storytelling, as well as the moments shared before falling asleep. This chapter represents another intermediate level of time: the space between wakefulness and sleep. 'Bedtime Stories' recounts moments when parents tell stories to their children in the embrace of cosy tranquillity, when couples share stories with each other, and when friends spend time together. Zhanina has experienced this intimate fragment of time and space almost every evening since her son was born. It is a special ritual that is repeated every evening, yet constantly changing. As her son grows up, she perceives the stories differently.






"Transparent bodies, mirroring shadows" is the fourth chapter of my project INTERSTICE (a space or a place between things and events.) The project represents the space and time, the gaps and cracks which ultimately connect our lives by being part of our identity.


Transparent bodies is a metaphor of certain memories and thoughts one can have which are materialized in an interstitial place - indeed the mind and the heart. They can be about people, places, happenings, words one had experienced, shaping our perception about life.

How is it possible a shadow to mirror something? Maybe it is not. Or maybe the transparent bodies have shadows which are reflecting the dreams, thoughts and feelings a person can carry. The works which are part of the installation are unique screen prints which are based on analog ink drawings. Each piece is one of a kind and yet has a repetitive character as the memories, thought process and feelings we as individuals can experience on a daily basis.

"Corridor Gap"

*(no) Room for doubt

A chance that something might not be as straight-forward or true as it seems.

A possibility that something is not as clear or true as it seems.

Symbolically, metaphorically and literally, the name describes a spatial installation which, like the other chapters, is part of the INTERSTICE project. The concept of Room for doubt is, through different works (in this case again screen prints on transparent and semi-transparent materials), to create a "room", which has aspects of a labyrinth, where the viewer can enter and meet another one, while still being devided by the transparent layers of works. Translucent materials seem to show what is happening from the inside-out and vice versa. By overlaying and interweaving the different images and levels of transparency, an illusion is created as if the images are woven into each other. The transparent materials create layers which have a look-through aspect, which allow the viewer the gaze the images which are closer to them, while seeing the ones on the back.

Memory diving is my favorite hobby

To me, memories are an entire category of visual art. Like a form of art which contains all art categories and all senses. I can see, feel, hear and smell them.

Some memories are like drawings, some are like paintings and some are like stamp. The ones which are formed as drawings are the ones which we are transforming and retouching overtime. Our mind erases some aspects about them and it changes the memories so they are more suitable for us.

Then there are some memories which are vivid and wild like a painting, they are just in front of my eyes and I feel I like I can almost touch them. They are painted with colors I can't change even if I want to. They are perfectly imperfect. They should stay as they are. When I have enough of these memories, I will usually pull the curtain and cover them for awhile.

The third type, the stamp, is the print which cannot be reproduced! These are the hardest to describe, because they are so precious and sacred. They are not just visualization of my mind, but an entire space, another dimension, in which I can dive into and swim.

This act makes me feel like I can be at two places at the same time.

...In fact, when it comes to life or my art, I've never believed in plans and precise concepts. The most realistic and workable plan for me would be a combination of vision and knowledge; decisions I make during the process; coincidences and mistakes. The paradoxical aspect about my practice is perhaps the fact that I never draw up a coherent plan about it, but I always strive to have control over many aspects of it, remaining guided by my intuition as well. This oxymoron, I call natural habitat.

I have always liked to "imagine", as if I let my imagination write scenarios before my eyes. However, the most important thing about this hobby is to part (forget?) with your expectations. Although it is a big cliché, the interaction between the vision of a thing and the expectations that would be set, often reproduce a huge amount of dissatisfaction and this leads to deconstructive thoughts and feelings. On the other hand, theories and beliefs about randomness and coincidence are countless. I don't think I even want to summarize them. "Carefully planned coincidence" is the exact feeling that accompanied me as I was working on my latest cycle of works. This idea is also deeply woven into my relationship with printmaking and more specifically screen printing. A long and precisely calculated process that involves the creation of multiple copies. In this case, I use screen printing as a tool to create unique pieces that carry the character of paintings. Based on real-size analog ink drawings, the motifs I reprint and combine together are transforming into a different image each time. #

There is no test print, no planning of color matching when I am printing. I don't even have a record of the combination of pigments of the colors I personally mix and print with. Printing the large motifs directly onto the chosen surface without testing them could lead to errors or imperfections, but this is an absolutely conscious and desired process.

But you can never have a strong relationship with the sea if you cannot swim. No one is born being able to swim. Therefore, it is the first lesson. - there is not always a life vest that you can rely on to continue swimming;



... and please never forget about the stream. The choice is yours: swimming with or against the tide.

Image overload: one side of the mattress printed with already existing motifs that I have developed for previous exhibitions. The mixture and accumulation of motifs is symbolic of the images that put us to sleep every day in the digital world. The visitor is invited to sit or lie down alone or with someone else on the mattress. The visitor is asked to hide their phone in the mattress (*there is a zip on the mattress case) and having them set an alarm on the phone as a „10 minutes count down”. This act makes it certain that the visitor will spend at least 10 minutes without a phone during the show.

Information overload: If this side of the mattress is not satisfying enough, the viewer can turn the mattress to the other side and choose one of the practical ideas written on it. Each activity can be done without a phone (or a digital tool) within 10 minutes, but outside the exhibition space.

The pale pink side of the mattress filled with text is a symbol of the information and ideas that flood the digital space every day, which more often can create a sense of anxiety and imbalance rather than a sense of being informed, creative or calm.



"Immersing into the toxicity spectrum" is a participatory project with the intention to raise awareness about behaviours that can be considered red flags, potentially leading to toxic and abusive relationships and, in some extreme cases, to femicides. Additionally, it provides to women* the opportunity to help others by sharing their experiences.

A box was circulating throughout different events of [StoP organization](#) and another one remained in [Library Wieden \(Vienna, Austria\)](#). Nearby, papers and pens were provided for people who identify themselves as women be able to write sentences related to behaviours they have heard and witnessed from their abusers which can be identified as red flags in relationships. Also, women* who have never been in a toxic or abuse relationship, but wanted to contribute by sharing a red flag sentence, were welcomed to participate. Beside the physical boxes, there was an online form as well.

The entire process was absolutely anonymous.
